USING FIBRES & THREADS

This ancient craft utilizes nature's resources (often otherwise destined for the compost heap). In these eco-friendly classes you will learn what leaves, vines and grasses to harvest, how to prepare them and what traditional techniques to use. You will incorporate fibres and threads into your work and take home your own beautiful and functional garlic basket or stitched basket.
